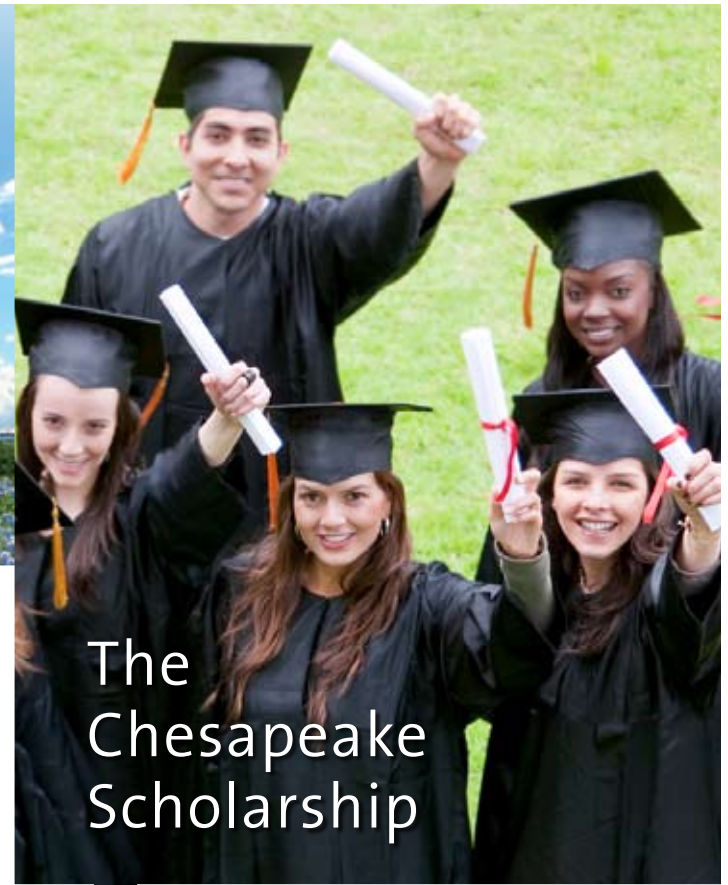

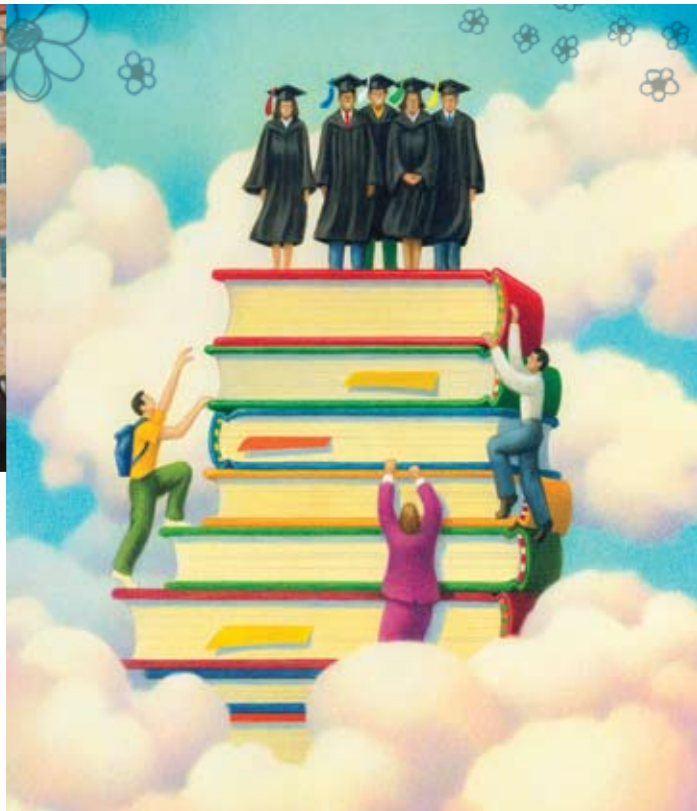

## About the Scholarship



Chesapeake Energy initiated the Chesapeake Scholarship through a partnership with DFW International Airport. With an initial investment from Chesapeake, the communities of Dallas and Fort Worth responded to a challenge to match the funds. Today, the program is endowed with \$3.75 million to help minority students go to college. Sometimes the only obstacle preventing a high school senior from becoming a college graduate is the financial means to attend a university. Each year, community-based committees award Chesapeake Scholarships to dedicated students. This allows qualified students in all Fort Worth ISD schools to attend the college or vocational school of their choice without worrying about how to pay for tuition, books or room and board.

## How to Qualify

To be considered for a scholarship toward a college degree or vocational certification you must first submit an application. The deadline for submissions is April 15, 2010. Criteria for scholarship applicants include the following:

- Must be a graduating senior of a Fort Worth ISD high school
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0
- Must have taken the ACT or SAT
- Must have applied to and plan to attend an accredited college, university, or vocational school
- Must be a U.S. citizen or legal resident living in Dallas or Tarrant County
- Must be a female or a member of a minority group as defined by the DFW Airport Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBE) program. The term minority generally includes the following groups: African American, Hispanic American, Native American, and Asian American.
